MEETING MINUTES

A public meeting of the Interim Emergency Board was held in House Committee Room 3 on November 21, 2013, at 9:00 a.m.

Sen. Donahue had questions about how the presented items had been selected for this action. Mr. Moses explained that these items could not be funded this fiscal year unless additional capacity is found, which is not likely. Therefore, they were being moved from P2 to P5 with a non-cash line of credit so they could be considered for prioritization by the legislature during the 2014 session. By taking the requested action today, it would put the projects in a much better position for future funding than if they were to remain in P2.

Sen. Donahue motioned to approve; second by Rep. Fannin. The motion passed with no objection.

ITEM NO. 4

PROJECT ALTERATION IN ACT 24 OF 2013: A request from the Department of Veterans Affairs that the scope of the description of its project (03/130-178 on page 16 [FPC No. 03-130-13-01]) in the amount of \$800,000 Priority 2 general obligation bonds and \$5,821,338 Federal Funds for Northeast Louisiana State Cemetery, Planning and Construction (Ouachita) be adjusted according to the provisions of R.S. 39:461.9 to change the parish of this project from Ouachita to Richland.

Mr. Moses explained that scope change would move the project from Ouachita to Richland Parish, and the funding would remain the same. Mr. Fannin stated that this project was in his district when located in Ouachita Parish, but it was his understanding that the federal government had determined that this location change would better serve Louisiana's veterans. Rep. Charles Chaney, who represents Richland Parish, said that the federal government had done a study and determined Richland Parish to be a better location.

With no further discussion, Rep. Fannin moved to approve; second by Mr. Henson. The motion passed without objection.

ITEM NO. 5

PROJECT ALTERATION IN ACT 24 OF 2013: A request from the Jefferson Davis Parish Police Jury that the scope of the description of its project (50/J27-1177 on page 72 [FPC No. 50-J27-13-01]) in the amount of \$835,000 Priority 2 and \$9,165,000 Priority 5 general obligation bonds for Regional Consolidated Jail Facility, Planning and Construction be adjusted according to the provisions of R.S. 39:461.9 to change the title of the project to "Acquisition and Renovation of Existing Building and Site for Regional Consolidated Jail Facility."

Mr. Moses explained that this request would provide for purchase and renovation of an existing building site since a suitable building had been found for the project.

Speaker Kleckley moved to approve; second by Lt. Gov. Dardenne. The motion passed without objection.

With no further business to conduct, at 9:29am the meeting was adjourned by acclamation.

Jefferson Davis Parish is in critical need of new jail facilities. The jail capacity has remained relatively unchanged since 1964. The crime rate and the need for detention has out-paced the capacity of the existing jail system. At present, the jail capacity of 120 inmates has become inadequate for criminals and sometimes dangerous criminals cannot be kept off the streets of Jefferson Davis parish due to lack of inmate capacity. This has also led to not serving hundreds of bench warrants due to the lack of inmate capacity. Therefore, it has also been recommended by an independent study prepared by Michael M. Kurth, PhD and Daryl V. Burckel, DBA, CPA, to construct a new 200 inmate state-of-the-art jail facility and consolidate the four jails in the parish with the construction of this Regional Jail Facility. This jail will provide adjoining parishes with the necessary jail capacity to meet their demand for jail space above their capacities. As noted in Prior Funding, this project has been approved for \$835,000 Priority 2 LOC and \$9,165,000 Priority 5 LOC in Act 24, 2013. This project was for the Planning & Construction of a new facility. Due to current opportunities, this project is undergoing a scope changed to "Acquisition and Renovation of Existing Building and Site for Regional Consolidated Jail Facility". The Parish will utilize \$4 million in their funds to purchase the existing Southern Barbeque building and site for renovation for the Consolidated Jail Facility. The Police Jury certifies that it does not need/nor will request the P5 be moved up to P1 at this time. The Police Jury has and will provide the remaining necessary funds in order to proceed with Phase 1 (building acquisition), based on the Office of Administration's agreement to reimburse the Police Jury \$4 million for the purchase of the existing bldg./site contingent on a commitment for the Administration (Commissioners Office) to move P5 to P1 next legislative session.
