Narratives

Disaster Damage:

In 2016, Louisiana had two separate events that qualified for appropriation under Public Laws 114-223 and 114-254. The state experienced severe storms and flooding in both March (Disaster Number 4263) and August (Disaster Number 4277) 2016 - collectively referred to as the 2016 Severe Storms and Flooding - resulting in 56 of the state's 64 parishes receiving a federal disaster declaration. From the March event, more than 16,462 homes have Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Verified Loss and 5,222 renters have FEMA Verified Loss (FVL), for a total of 21,684 households. The National Weather Service designated the August flooding event that dropped an unprecedented 7 trillion gallons of rainwater in South Louisiana as a "1,000-year" rainfall event. It resulted in the flooding of more than 68,380 homes with FVL and 23,248 renters with FVL, for a total of 91,628 households. The August storm claimed 13 lives. March Storm (DR-4263) In early March 2016, a storm system brought heavy thunderstorms from west to east across most of Louisiana. In addition to wind damage, record flooding occurred along the Bogue Falaya River in Covington and Bayou Dorcheat at Lake Bistineau. Governor John Bel Edwards declared a state of emergency for several parishes and sent the National Guard to help with search-and-rescue missions. The State of Louisiana estimates that this storm caused damage to more than 21,684 residences, forced 13,000 evacuations and 2,780 rescues, damaged another 6,143 structures, and caused numerous road closures. Road and bridge damage estimates totaled\$20 million. Agricultural losses totaled approximately \$15 million, with long-term impacts to farmers estimated at \$80 million. In addition, more than 40,000 citizens registered for FEMA Individual Assistance (IA). Thirty-six Louisiana parishes were declared eligible for FEMA IA: Allen, Ascension, Avoyelles, Beauregard, Bienville, Bossier, Caddo, Calcasieu, Caldwell, Catahoula, Claiborne, DeSoto, East Carroll, Franklin, Grant, Jackson, LaSalle, Lincoln, Livingston, Madison, Morehouse, Natchitoches, Ouachita, Rapides, Red River, Richland, Sabine, St. Helena, St. Tammany, Tangipahoa, Union, Vernon, Washington, Webster, West Carroll and Winn. Seven of these parishes also flooded in August: Ascension, Avoyelles, Livingston, St. Helena, St. Tammany, Tangipahoa and Washington. August Storm (DR-4277) In mid-August 2016, a slow-moving storm impacted multiple South Louisiana parishes with sustained heavy rain. In what was a 1,000-year flood, within two days more than two feet of rain was measured in some areas, causing extensive surface and river flooding. Both the Amite and Comite rivers overtopped, as well as numerous bayous, lakes and canals located within these drainage basins. Governor John Bel Edwards declared a state of emergency for several parishes and sent the National Guard to help with search-and-rescue missions. An estimated 8,000 people were evacuated to emergency shelter sites. The American Red Cross, the state and faith-based organizations operated these sites. A state-operated medical site was established to serve individuals with medical needs. Roughly 30,000 search and rescues were performed, with 11,000 citizens sheltered at the peak of the flood. Thedamage to infrastructure, businesses and homes across the southern region of the state was extensive. Large sections of state roads remained underwater for extended periods. Anestimated 30 state roads washed out and 1,400 bridges require inspection. Along with more than 200 highways that closed during the event, sections of Interstates 10 and 12 closed for multiple days due to floodwaters. Some stretches of I-10 remained closed for nearly a week, significantly interrupting interstate commerce. More than 91,628 homes have documented damages to date. An estimated 31 percent of homes in the declared parishes were impacted by flooding, w

Recovery Needs:

Combined, these disasters affected 56 of the state's 64 parishes, with 51 parishes declared eligible for FEMA IA. The assessment below estimates unmet needs in three main categories of damage: housing, economy and infrastructure.HUD has identified the 10 most impacted parishes from these two events as Acadia, Ascension, East Baton Rouge, Lafayette, Livingston, Ouachita, St. Tammany, Tangipahoa, Vermilion and Washington.

Housing Needs:

Across both disasters, 113,312 households were found to have some level of documented damage, including 84,842 owner-



occupied and 28,470 renter households.

Homeowners: Of particular concern is the high proportion of owner-occupied households with damage who did not report carrying insurance through the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). In total, 72 percent of all impacted owner-occupied households, or 61,069, did not report having insurance. This represents a unique situation for the state, as in previous significant disaster events – hurricanes Katrina, Rita, Gustav, Ike and Isaac – there was a reasonable anticipation some damages may have been attributable to wind or other events that may have been covered by a homeowner's hazard insurance policy. As these events were flood-exclusive, the state has no such reasonable anticipation any of the losses incurred by this population were met by other insurance policies. It is important to note 68,319 of the total 84,842 owner-occupied households with damage are located within the ten-parish most impacted area, representing more than 81 percent of the total. Additionally, 51,742 households within that population are likely to have unmet needs, with damage levels at "major-low," "major-high" or "severe." This population represents more than 90 percent of the 57,631 affected owner-occupied households likely to have unmet needs.

Rental Housing: Like the owner-occupied household population, an unusually high proportion of affected renter households were located outside of a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA). Specifically, 12,921 impacted renter households were located outside of the SFHA, representing more than 45 percent of the total affected renter household population. As such, while this may not inherently indicate exacerbated need for the renter population itself, it may indicate an enhanced need for landlords who may not have carried flood insurance. Furthermore, there was a lack of affordable housing stock prior to the 2016 flooding events. It is important to note 25,701 of the total 28,470 renter households with damage are located within the 10-parish most impacted area, representing more than 90 percent of the total.

Homeless Population: The state is committed to providing temporary housing solutions and, wherever possible, permanent housing to households that are homeless or at-risk of homelessness. The Point-in-time count is an annual count of sheltered and unsheltered homeless persons on a single night conducted by Continuums of Care (CoC) across the United States. To understand the homeless population prior to flooding within IA parishes and the 10 most impacted parishes, this analysis counts CoCs that contain at least one IA or most impacted parish. Eight CoC's contain IA parishes, withg, and 1,138 unsheltered). Four CoCs contain the 10 most impacted parishes, with a total of 1,398 people counted as homeless (422 counted in emergency shelter, 719 in transitional housing, and 257 unsheltered). 96 percent of people counted as experiencing homelessness on Jan. 25, 2016 were within IA parishes, and 35 percent of the state's total people experiencing homelessness were within most impacted parishes.

Note on Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing: The State will comply with Section 104(b) (2) of Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (Public Law 90-284), as amended, administering all programs and activities relating to housing and community development in a manner to affirmatively further fair housing. Title VIII further prohibits discrimination against any person in the sale or rental of housing, or the provision of brokerage services, including in any way making unavailable or denying a dwelling to any person, because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, handicap or familial status.

Economy:

Immediately following the August event, the Louisiana Department of Economic Development (LED) partnered with Louisiana State University (LSU) to conduct an assessment of economic damages resulting from the DR-4277 flooding event. Key details are:

- At the peak of the August event, 19,900 Louisiana businesses or roughly 20 percent of all Louisiana businesses were disrupted by the flooding event. FEMA has since referred approximately 22,000 businesses to SBA for recovery assistance.
 - A disruption of 278,500 workers or 14 percent of the Louisiana workforce occurred at the peak of the flooding event.
- An economic loss estimated at roughly \$300 million in labor productivity and \$836 million in terms of value added during the period immediately surrounding the flood.
 - Approximately 6,000 businesses experienced flooding.
 - The LSU Ag Center estimates Louisiana agricultural losses of over \$110 million.

Infrastructure

The FEMA Public Assistance (PA) Program is designed to provide immediate assistance to the impacted jurisdictions for emergency work and permanent work on infrastructure and community facilities. For DR-4263, the state's obligation has been established as not less than 25 percent of eligible project costs. For DR-4277, the state's obligation has been established as not less than 10 percent of eligible project costs.

established as not less than 10 percent of eligible project costs.

As of Nov. 21, 2016, \$36,501,492 has been identified in PA need for DR-4263 and \$247,039,464 has been identified for DR-4277. GOHSEP estimates these totals to rise to \$93,751,791 for DR-4263 and \$750,000,000 for DR-4277. Based on these data, the current unmet need is \$12,167,167 for DR-4263 and \$27,448,829 for DR-4277. Long term, based on GOHSEP's projections, the state estimates this unmet need to grow to \$31,250,597 for DR-4263 and \$83,333,333 for DR-4277, respectively, for a grand total of \$114,583,930.

Public Service Unmet Needs:

Leadership and key staff of all impacted communities have identified needs in all service areas handled by a government entity, such as the flooding of fire, police stations and other government buildings,

whichprovidekeypublicservicestocitizensaswellaslarge-scaleinfrastructureprojectsthat willneed to be implemented in order to recover. Funding is a severe handicap, especially compounded by the fact that sales tax and other revenue streams to local government have declined, or are expected to decline, once the initial buying of cars, building materials, etc., subsides. Therefore, the approved budgets for the upcoming fiscal year are having to be revisited and modified, which includes the deferral of planned projects and a potential decrease in staffing for fire and police and other services to meet the immediate recovery needsoftheparishes. For example, in Livingston Parish alone, the parish lost a minimum of 10 firetrucks, 33 police vehicles, 61 school buses and 20 other parish-related vehicles which will need to be replaced, impacting the funding for other projects. Due to the limited funding available to address the full breadth of recovery needs, the state is not prioritizing funding to address the public service needs described above. However, in anticipation of additional funding being made available, OCD-DRU will be implementing a program by which it will provide funding to cover the non-federal share of FEMA Public Assistance projects. Funds will be provided as payment to state or local entities for eligible activities within approved Project Worksheets. The match funding will lessen the financial burden placed on the entities and assist them to continue normal operations and address recovery needs.

Overall Progress Narrative:

Program Funds Drawdown

In 2023 Quarter 3, OCD continued making progress on the following programs by working with its local, state, regional partners, and stakeholders to assess outstanding unmet recovery needs, as well as develop and amend programs to address those unmet needs. The progress on the individual programs comprising the Flood grant is as follows:



Restore Louisiana Homeowner Program - Great Floods of 2016

The program initially implemented a survey deadline of July 20, 2018 and an application deadline of October 1, 2018. On September 24, 2018, the survey was re-opened, and the application deadline was extended in response to the announcement of a potential change to the Small Business Administration (SBA) duplication of benefits (DOB) policy. The survey submission deadline was October 19, 2018, and the application deadline was November 16, 2018. As of September 30, 2023, there were 56,262 survey submissions. 45,440 homeowners were determined to be Phases 1 – VI. Survey responses are used to place homeowners into different phases of the program. 45,440 (100%) of these homeowners have had environmental reviews completed and 45,440 have been invited to apply. 37,182 homeowners (82%) submitted applications. 17,265 grant awards were offered to homeowners, amounting to \$ 669,832,808.93. Of those, 17,264 homeowners (100.0%) have executed their grant agreements, obligating \$ 670,697,445.47.

RLHP Great Floods of 2016 Interim Housing Assistance Program

As different federal funding programs are tapering off and are no longer available to reduce or eliminate interim housing costs paid to some pogram participants, the RLHP provides assistance related to additional eligible rental or mortgage expenses for up to 20 months, provided the household is at or below 120% AMI and is an active applicant within the RLHP. This program closed as of 9/30/2022. As of September 30, 2023, the program has assisted 274 total active RLHP homeowners with temporary housing assistance while their homes are being repaired or reconstructed, with \$3,871,856.45 in assistance paid to date. Of these, 210 applicants were temporarily housed in a hotel; 3 applicants were initially housed in a hotel and then transferred to a longer-term rental due to the scope of their repair/reconstruction project; 64 applicants were housed directly to a rental unit. The obligated total funding for the total 274 approved THA participants is \$5,000,397.02.

RLHP Great Floods of 2016 Insurance Assistance Program

HUD new activity approval was received on June 3, 2019. The Flood Insurance Assistance (FIA) program began implementation on Monday, July 22, 2019. As of September 30, 2023, 176 applications have been submitted by homeowners. Of these, 123 applications were approved totaling \$112,442.77 in premiums obligated. Of these, 118 applicants have closed on their grant for a total of \$95,695.36 paid.

Solution 4

OCD offered acquisition of properties located in floodways across the state within the Restore Louisiana Homeowner Programs' Solution 4; As of June 30, 2022, 541 Total applications submitted, 142 grant awards (26.24%) were offered to homeowners, for a total of \$14,975,068.13. Of these 138 closed on their buyout or buyout &incentive. Twenty-Eight properties remain in Demolition Status. 30 of these properties are Pecan Acres properties that will transition to Disposed status will all buyouts are completed. 8 properties remaining in demolition status are Solution 4 properties that have a servitude. 93 final dispositions were made. Construction is ongoing in Audubon Estates, for former Pecan Acres residents. Six homes in Audubon Estates were completed as of June 30, 2023 and five Pecan Acres Buyouts with homes in Audubon Estates closed as of June 30, 2023. One additional home closed during 3rd quarter. The final home to be completed for Pecan Acres residents is near completion and is projected to close by Nov 8, 2023. One resident continues to occupy their home in Pecan Acres, and this time is not participating in the program. ORA has completed, all residents



have moved into their permanent housing. Two homes in Audubon Estates will not transfer to Pecan Acres residents.

Multifamily Restoration Loan Program

The program's deadline for application was September 29, 2017. Developers and Public Housing Authorities with flood-damaged properties from across the disaster-impacted areas submitted applications. Louisiana Housing Corporation (LHC) has reviewed 13 applications for funding of affordable housing structures with 20 or greater units. Twelve (12) projects awarded, of which four are PHAs. However, two PHA's have decided to return the funds due to capacity for rehabilitation. To date, LHC has made full reimbursements to eight projects and expended \$11,698,964 to restore 438 flood-damaged units fully. Close out procedures have begun on the projects that are 100% expended. Eight (8) packages have been submitted to the developer and six (6) has been returned. The goal is to send close out packages to all MRLF projects by end of 2023. Eunice PHA, last PHA, has closed; construction has begun. Denham Springs - potentially being un-obligated.

Restore Piggyback Program

Developers from across the isaster-impacted areas submitted applications for both Low Income Housing Tax Credits as well as CDBG – DR funds. Louisiana Housing Corporation (LHC) received and reviewed 28 applications for funding of either new construction or rehabitation of affordable housing structures. LHC awarded nine projects for a total of \$36.8 Million in CDBG – DR funding and 918 units. Additional funding in the amount of \$38 Million, or Round 2, was approved under APA11. LHC was able to fund an additional 10 projects from the waitlist, resulting in adding another 935 units to the program. The overall units funded of 1,424, of that 1,247 are below 80% AMI which includes 127 PSH units. To date, the program has closed fourteen (14) developments: Thirteen (13) have completed construction and are leased up and/or beginning lease up. Two (2) are under construction, and expected to be completed by end of 2023. One has not closed, but expected to prior to the end of 2023.

Resilient and Mixed Income Piggyback Program

This program will specifically seek to fund transactions, which will be more disaster resilient than is otherwise typically required in affordable multifamily housing development. Potential projects are located in the 10 HUD designated most impacted parishes from the 2016 flood events. Additionally, this program is limited to new construction only. The NOFA (Notice of Funding Availability) was published December 13, 2019. Louisiana Housing Corporation (LHC) received and reviewed 21 applications. Final awards were published on June 24, 2020. LHC awarded 14 developments for a total of \$106.2 million in CDBG-DR funding. They will deliver 1,233 units, all affordable, which includes 65 PSH units. The PRIME program has closed all fourteen (14) developments in thirteen months, from the date of awards. Thirteen (13) projects have completed construction and lease up has begun. One (1) is 93% completed construction, and expected to be complete by next quarter.

Neighborhood Landlord Recovery Program

There are 264 unit in this program and over half of the applications have closed and received a Notice to Proceed. LHC has received construction complete notifications representing 111 units to date. Many of the units are leased up while others are in the process of finding incomequalified tenants. Currently there are 54 units under construction and 34 units are expected to be completed by December. LHC executed the closing documents for a development consisting of six new units, which will begin construction in the next month and scheduled to be completed by the 1st quarter of 2024. During the 2nd quarter of 2023, LHC expended \$1,125,000.00 for completed construction of 12 new affordable housing



units. LHC Compliance recently conducted final inspection and HQS inspections on 12 new units completed in Ascension Parish, which are now being leased up. LHC staff continue to work with applicants to also complete annual tenant reviews and order HQS inspections for units that have been completed and leased up.

Neighborhood Landlord Program Phase II

There are 23 eligible units remaining in this program. LHC staff has executed the closing and issued a Notice to Proceed for four units to date. Two of the projects that closed under NLRP II ran into challenges with permitting, which resulted in delays. One of these projects was able to work through their issues and is now close to 75% complete with construction, but the other development had to revise their plans, which had to be re-evaluated by environmental staff. LHC completed the environmental re-evaluations needed for this development last week and has now issued a Notice to Proceed. As proposed LHC has now issued commitments and completed the environmental re-evaluations for six of the properties, which previously had commitments through the Sanction Funds BR Developer 2022 program. There are three remaining projects, which still needed to go out for public comment, which have been published.

Neighborhood Landlord Program Phase III

LHC has issued conditional award letters for 24 units and have requested the environmental reviews for each; five units have been environmentally cleared to date. LHC is working to confirm the final budgets for these developments and to schedule the closings. LHC issued deadline letters to two remaining applicants, who applied for assistance.

Rapid Rehousing

There were no applicants served this quarter. START is currently requesting payment for amounts previously withheld due to missing supporting documents. All START PD requests for payments have been received by LHC. The following projects have been closed: Acadiana Outreach Center, Salvation Army, Tangipahoa Parish Government, and St. Mary Community Action Agency. The project received 1,318 applications for assistance. 945 households received assistance. All CDBG-DR contracts have been satisfied. LHC is currently processing the final invoices for payment for final contractor. The closeout for Start Corporation remains open-closeout pending.

Permanent Supportive Hsg Services

No new applicants this quarter. There were 779 households served since the beginning of the program. Program is in closeout phase.

Safe Haven Program

This program approval came in APA 11 and has a \$4 Million project. LHC selected two providers to develop Safe Haven shelters. Both projects are moving forward with the process. Hope Connections has received final fire Marshall Approval, signed the closeout document, and the punch list within the upcoming week. Catholic Charities has scheduled Fire Marshall Inspection, and has a final inspection scheduled for October 25. The expectation is that both will have projects completed by December 2023.

Soft Second Program

As of September 30, 2023 LHC has committed a total of \$5,848,146 to assist approximately 151 homeowners.



Restore Louisiana Small Business Loan

The program has launched and application intake began on May 1, 2023. Each Lender is actively accepting and processing applications. Program documents are being prepared to be placed into IGX. The four Lenders administering loans for this Program are South Central Planning, New Corp, Regional Loan Corp, and North Delta. Application intake is expected to end on December 31, 2023.

Farm Recovery Grant Program

The Agriculture and Forestry Program have provided grants to 956 producers impacted by the flood of 2016. The affected individuals have demonstrated a commitment to remain in the agricultural industry. The aforementioned producers have submitted losses based on the programs design. Funds have allowed said producers to maintain pre-flood employment levels and/or hire new employees. All eligible grants were processed and the close out process has started.

Total Expended- \$19,741,171.00

First Responders Public Service Program

EBR Sheriff's Department spent \$1,200,700.00 towards the purchase of vehicles and equipment. East Side Fire Department spent \$490,440.00 towards the purchase of masks and cameras. Both programs and activities currently have a zero balance. CEAs and program are now closed.

FEMA Match Program

The Office of Community Development continues to work with the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness (GOHSEP) to provide reimbursement for the Non-Federal Cost Share (Match) of eligible FEMA PA projects. The Match payment is made after GOHSEP closes the project. The program budget is \$115 million. Currently, the program has 246 Grantees and 1,363 projects.

WaterShed

LWI Technical Design and Quality Team (TDQ)

In furtherance of statewide hydrologic and hydraulic (H&H) modeling efforts, the LWI Technical Design and Quality Team (TDQ) met many times during this quarter to deliberate, discuss and comment on proposed H&H modeling model setups; storage solutions and proposed pilot program; and start Design Storms Pilot, Transition Zone/ compound flooding methods, and more. With regard to State Agency alignment activities:

- A1 Develop a simple, accurate depiction of the role and responsibilities of state agencies in relation to flood risk management for use by agencies and stakeholders.
- Changes have been made the operational guidance to support development of Round 2 projects

Regional Capacity Building Grant

During this quarter, there were a total of 27 local engagement meetings or Regional Steering Committee (RSC) meetings. Four of the eight regions have exhausted Phase I budgets and are working on Phase II to continue funding regional capacity building activities and to create a preliminary watershed plan. Each region has been continuing to diligent work to restructure their steering committees in order to fulfill the requirements of the Round 2 funding for LWI. Biweekly Watershed Coordinator calls have been held to facilitate coordination of efforts within the regions. In addition to hosting Regional Steering Committee meetings grantees worked on multiple complementary efforts including data collection mechanism for comprehensive project invenory, participating in conferences, facilitating statewide modeling program, updating local stakeholders, providing technical assistance to local communities on grant applications, meeting with local schools, local advocacy, and educational groups to discuss the value and importance of resilience planning and convening meetings of CRS user groups.

PRO Louisiana Workforce Program

The Heavy Equipment Operator programs at the LCTCS are continuing to recruit and train students for this employment sector. The program is winding down as far as our financial contribution is involved. However, LCTCS has indicated that they plan to continue to provide the programs among their course offerings.

Louisiana Military Department – Affordable Rental Housing – Camp Beauregard The project includes construction of 25 stand-alone residences, which consist of a mix of three and four bedroom units. The housing structures replace modular housing units at Camp Beauregard that date from the late 1970's and are within the confines of Camp Beauregard. The replacement housing project will create a typical residential neighborhood setting conducive to sound family life and includes typical residential roadways, sidewalks, utilities, and drainage infrastructure. For a period of not less than 10-years, at least 51% of the total housing structures shall be reserved for LMI eligible families. As of September 2023, Camp Beauregard is 93% complete. There is no beneficiary data to report at this time. The CEA is extended to 10/15/2023.

Rural Repair and Rehabilitation Program - created in partnership with USDA to ensure the long-term viability and to preserve rural multifamily properties. All developments funded through this program will benefit low to moderate-income populations. The program was published on June 9, 2023. Deadline for preliminary applications was September 1, 2023. Because the program is undersubscribed, all 11 applicants will be given a chance to submit their full applications on November 30, 2023. Preliminary applications are under threshold review by staff.

OCD-CDBG Homeownership (OCHO) Pilot Program

The program is in the process of being redesigned. Management and Operations will be separated. Lemoine and Dynamic will complete construction. A market study was completed. Task orders are being drafted.

Middle-Market Loan Program (MMLP)

The Middle-Market Loan Program will provide gap financing to support the rehab and/or construction of multi-family buildings that serve a range of household



incomes, with the goal of using higher-cost units to generate deeper affordability for LMI renters.

That range of "middle-market" rents also allows participants to embed units with deeper affordability into higher-income areas, which provides good, stable housing in high-opportunity areas to low-income families, and encourages socioeconomic integration in communities. Projects funded through MMLP will require OCD standards of safety, environmental sustainability, and resilience to storm hazards, which will not only ensure the longevity and quality of those projects, but will also positively influence design and building standards for Louisiana's affordable housing industry. Three awards were made from this program for 302 units to be constructed. One of the projects has closed to date and construction has begun. The remaining two are set to close no later than Q3-2023 with construction to begin shortly afterwards.

Fast Gap Program

FAST GAP will primarily address financing needs of affordable multifamily rental housing development transactions that have failed to close due to a financing gap resulting from construction cost increases and/or changes in originally sufficient financing commitments, which occurred prior to financial closing. Six projects were selected for funding; however, due to various reasons, only two of the projects are set to close under this program. Both projects have closed and construction has commenced.

Rental Affordability Preservation Program - RAAP

The program has not launched and is in program design phase. Guidelines are being written. There is no beneficiary data to report, as the program is pending implementation.

Activity Description:

The state will enter into grant agreements with homeowners that result in the repair or reconstruction of flood-damaged residential owner-occupied structures. Given the time elapsed from the March and August flooding events, homeowners are in varied states of progress in their rebuilding process depending on the extent of damage and resources available. In response, the state will implement the Restore Louisiana Rehabilitation, Reconstruction and Reimbursement Program to cover eligible costs for the repair or replacement of damage to real property; replacement of disaster-impacted residential appliances; and limited environmental health hazard mitigation costs related to the repair of disaster-impacted property.

Homeowners will have four potential program solutions from which to choose based on their progress in the rebuilding process and their capacity to complete the rebuilding process. The state's programs will give homeowners the option to select their own contractor who will follow the state's requirements for rebuilding or work with a state-managed contractor. Additionally, homeowners that have completed partial or full repairs on their home prior to applying to the program, may be eligible to receive reimbursement for expenses incurred within HUD approved timelines. If homeowners have partially completed repairs or reconstruction of their



homes at the time of application to the program, they may be eligible for assistance for prospective work as well as reimbursement assistance for eligible work completed within the HUD established reimbursement guidelines. Consistent with HUD reimbursement guidelines, certain limited reimbursement may become available for repairs performed after the homeowner has applied to the program.

Elevations will be included for homeowners that meet requirements determined by the program, including substantially damaged properties in the floodplain. Elevation will be evaluated on a case-by- case basis. Elevations will not be conducted on properties outside of the floodplain, with the possible exception where elevation is required by local ordinance.

Homeowners will be eligible for the program if they meet the following criteria:

- · Owner occupant at time of disaster event
- Damaged address was the applicant's primary residence at the time of disaster event
- Located in one of 51 disaster declared parishes
- Suffered major or severe damages(1+ feet of flooding or \$8,000 FEMA Verified Loss)as a result of the 2016 Severe Storms and Flooding events
- Eligible structure as determined by program, including but not exclusive to, one or two family home structures, mobile/manufactured, and modular homes

Activity Description:

The state will enter into grant agreements with homeowners that result in the repair or reconstruction of flood-damaged residential owner-occupied structures. Given the time elapsed from the March and August flooding events, homeowners are in varied states of progress in their rebuilding process depending on the extent of damage and resources available. In response, the state will implement the Restore Louisiana Rehabilitation, Reconstruction and Reimbursement Program to cover eligible costs for the repair or replacement of damage to real property; replacement of disaster-impacted residential appliances; and limited environmental health hazard mitigation costs related to the repair of disaster-impacted property.

Homeowners will have four potential program solutions from which to choose based on their progress in the rebuilding process and their capacity to complete the rebuilding process. The state's programs will give homeowners the option to select their own contractor who will follow the state's requirements for rebuilding or work with a state-managed contractor. Additionally, homeowners that have completed partial or full repairs on their home prior to applying to the program, may be eligible to receive reimbursement for expenses incurred within HUD approved timelines. If homeowners have partially completed repairs or reconstruction of their homes at the time of application to the program, they may be eligible for assistance for prospective work as



well as reimbursement assistance for eligible work completed within the HUD established reimbursement guidelines. Consistent with HUD reimbursement guidelines, certain limited reimbursement may become available for repairs performed after the homeowner has applied to the program.

Elevations will be included for homeowners that meet requirements determined by the program, including substantially damaged properties in the floodplain. Elevation will be evaluated on a case-by- case basis. Elevations will not be conducted on properties outside of the floodplain, with the possible exception where elevation is required by local ordinance.

Homeowners will be eligible for the program if they meet the following criteria:

- · Owner occupant at time of disaster event
- Damaged address was the applicant's primary residence at the time of disaster event
- Located in one of 51 disaster declared parishes
- Suffered major or severe damages(1+ feet of flooding or \$8,000 FEMA Verified Loss)as a result of the 2016 Severe Storms and Flooding events
- Eligible structure as determined by program, including but not exclusive to, one or two family home structures, mobile/manufactured, and modular homes
